I am committed to breeding quality Cavaliers of good health and temperament. All of the Cavaliers I breed have had their hearts checked by a cardiologist and come from a long line of healthy dogs with strong hearts.

It's a good idea to buy a puppy directly from the breeder so you'll know the health back ground on your puppy. Then you can see the puppy's mother and possibly the father or other dogs related to the puppy your purchasing. I like to get to know all of my prospective buyers, and I keep a list of people who are interested in a cavalier puppy, what their lifestyle is like and what they're looking for in a puppy. ## Cavalier History or Legend

Here's some information for the Cavalier enthusiast. The King Charles Spaniel has been known as the comforter spaniel of royalty since the fifteenth century. The only dogs that King Henry VII would allow at his court were small spaniels for the ladies. They were given the title of comforter spaniels because the ladies would hold them close to their body for warmth on long carriage rides, or they might use them as foot warmers by placing them on their feet under their long floor length skirts.

They were named after King Charles II, because his spaniels were always at his side even as he laid on his death-bed.

John Churchill "The Duke of Marlborough" fancied the red and white spaniels known for their happy temperament and sporting instinct. When the Duke led the British Army to victory in the Battle of Blenheim in the early 1700's, the British government in gratitude, built Blenheim Palace for him on the Marlborough estate, and the little red and white spaniels raised there were known as Blenheim.

Legend has it that Sarah "The Duchess of Marlborough", was anxiously awaiting for news from the Battle of Blenheim. She was hoping for her husband's safe return and found comfort as she sat stroking the head of her favorite female Cavalier, (who was expecting at the time). Soon after that day, five puppies were born, and all with the MARK of the 'Duchess Thumb Print' on top their heads. Since then, it is desired for the Blenheim Spaniels to bear this Thumb Print or Blenheim Spot.

As you can see, The Cavalier King Charles Spaniel is very special. For when a Cavalier puppy comes into your life, it fills a special place...

## HERE'S A FEW QUESTIONS THAT I USUALLY ASK.

Remember a good breeder will evaluate you, as carefully as you evaluate them; they want to know that you will be an intelligent, responsible puppy owner.

**Question: Do you have a fenced in yard? What kind & how tall?**

Reason: Cavaliers should have a fenced in area to exercise in. They should not be staked out or tied up for long periods of time. Cavaliers are very curious, and have a short attention span. They Need to be kept on a leash when not in their fence, so they don't run after a squirrel or bird, across the street or run up to a large dog.

**Question: When you first bring him home, where will he be sleeping?**

Reason: The Cavalier is Not an outside dog, they do best living in the house as one of the family. Crate training helps with their house breaking and gives them a secure place of their own. Once house broken however, many of them seem to work their way into your heart and onto your bed.

**Question: What is the longest period of time your puppy would be left alone? Will he have the company of people, or other pets during the day?**

Reason: Cavaliers are very social; they will need some kind of company even more then other breeds. They do not like to be left alone and will prefer your company over other dogs or pets.

**Question: Do you have any children? How old are they? Do they know how to act around pets and small dogs?**

Reason: Cavaliers are very good with well-behaved children. Children should be taught however, how to pet and treat a dog, especially a cavalier. Never leave a small child unsupervised or alone with a puppy. A puppy would not know how to defend himself against being hurt or stepped on. Don't get a puppy with the idea of teaching your child responsibility; remember even if you have a responsible child, you will be the one responsible for feeding and taking care of your dog.

**Question: If you went on a trip who would you have take care of your dog? Would he be at his own home or some place else?**

Reason: Line up ahead of time, who will take care of your puppy, if you go away on a trip. Ideally, take him to where he could play with other Cavaliers or small dogs. Some people leave them with a friend or relative, or have some one stay at there home to care for their Cavalier so they don't have to leave their familiar surrounding.

The Cavalier King Charles Spaniel is a very special breed to me. My puppies are raised in my home as part of our family and I take great care to make sure that the homes I place my 'babies' in, will be a loving a happy home.
